

## Stockholm by Stieg

City tours bring novels to life

**IF YOU'RE LIKE MILLIONS OF OTHER READERS AROUND THE WORLD**, chances are you've devoured Swedish author Stieg Larsson's best-selling Millennium trilogy featuring journalist Mikael Blomkvist and social misfit/whiz-kid hacker Lisbeth Salander. You have probably seen the three Swedish film adaptations and might even be looking forward to the American version due out soon. But for a true Larsson fan, nothing compares to a visit to Stockholm, where you can trace the footsteps of the late author and his compelling characters on a guided walking tour developed by Stockholm City Museum.

The tour takes in key sites in the Södermalm district, including the buildings where Blomkvist and Salander "live" and the editorial headquarters of the fictional *Millennium* magazine, based on the real-life publication *Expo*, which Larsson co-founded. Along the way, guides share fascinating insight into Larsson's life, little-known facts about his novels and nuggets of Stockholm trivia. By the end of the roughly 90-minute tour, you'll want to grab your copy of *The Girl With the Dragon Tattoo* and start reading the books all over again.
